York St John University won two awards at the North Yorkshire Apprenticeship Awards 2024, with a number of other commendations for its provision of Degree Apprenticeships.

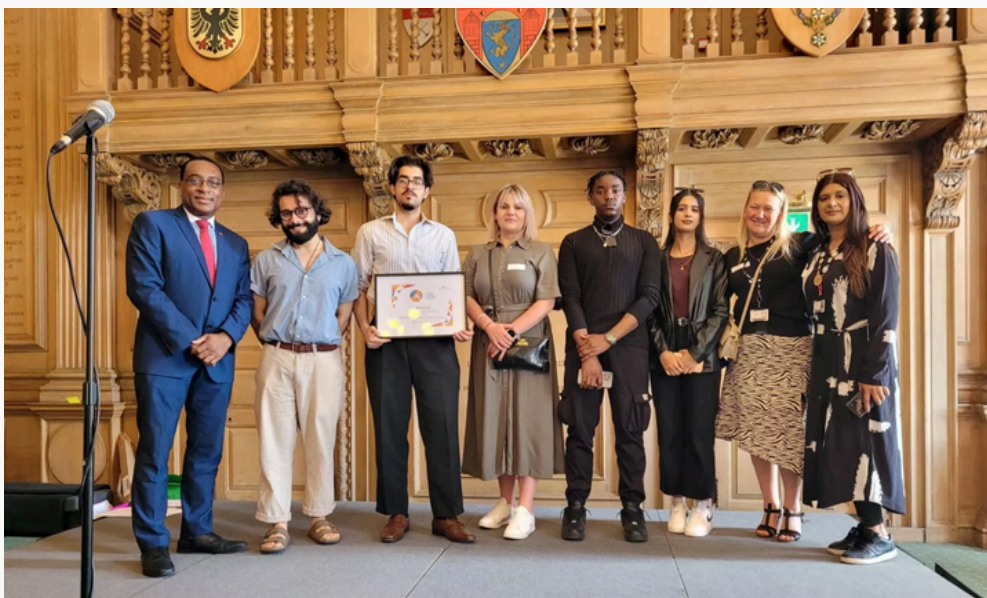

Apprentices take on National SkillsWeld Qualifiers 2024

Fabrication & Welding apprentices from Castleford College showed off their skills as part of the SkillsWeld 2024 National Qualifiers.

The competition, which was held on Tuesday 25th June at Castleford College, saw the apprentices complete four separate tests covering the three main types of welding processes – gas tungsten arc welding, stick welding and metal insert gas welding.

This included apprentices Benjamin Mace, Dale Robinson, Harry Walshaw, Joshua Curtis, Korey Wigglesworth, Paisley Mitchell and Oscar Emery, who represented the Yorkshire and Humberside in the competition.





Despite the fierce competition, judges Stephen Haymes, from Engineering Skills Competitions; Clive Slocombe, from Code A Weld; Chris Porter, from Air Products and Yasmin Whale, from Lincoln Engineering; chose their winners – with Oscar Emery taking home the first prize, Kalum Smart placing second and Joshua Curtis third.

Lorraine Cross, Group Executive Director – External Partnerships, Skills and Apprenticeships at the Heart of Yorkshire Education Group, presented the apprentices with their certificates.

The winners also received a bag of supplies to help them with their learning, which were kindly supplied by the competition sponsors, Air Products and Code A Weld.



Oscar Emery, Level 3 Fabrication and Welding Apprentice with Yorkshire and Laser Fabrication, said: *"Taking part in the National Qualifiers was a great experience and challenge for me. I'm extremely grateful to my tutors who have supported me throughout my studies and the competition."*

Taking place from Monday 14th until Friday 22nd November 2024, the finals will be held at Rochdale Training, a charity that supports learners into employment through Apprenticeships and adult courses.

Gary Wright, Fabrication and Welding Lecturer at Castleford College, said: *"This is our fifth year hosting the SkillsWeld national qualifiers and it's even more special as one of the judges, Yasmin, is a former Fabrication & Welding apprentice of the College. Yasmin was one of our first apprentices to take part in the competition in 2021, so it's incredibly rewarding to see seven apprentices here today putting their best foot forward. The SkillsWeld competition can open many doors to opportunities within the industry and Yasmin is a shining example of that."*

Former Fabrication & Welding apprentice, Lucas Moon, placed in the top four for Welding at the WorldSkills UK 2022 competition.

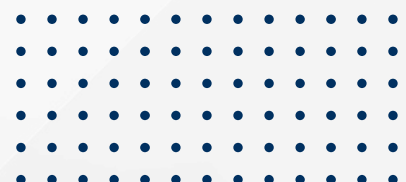
Following his performance, Lucas was selected to train on the squad for Great Britain's Welding team and which saw him compete in the European World Skills final in Poland.
