He spoke openly about the skills needs facing the region and the rural & coastal differences faced for the country's largest region.

We have a lot more we will be doing to support YNY as they approach devolution and this wont be the last time members will see & hear the mayor at our events – a Mayors event due in early 2025!

WYCA provided a detailed update on the WY skills plans and priorities and how the CA are engaging with the sector. There are big plans for the mayor on how skills will meet local area priorities such as mass transit, green homes and the WY promise – ensuring every young person has the opportunity to learn employer endorsed skills to enable them to become more employable.

We then heard from the West & North Yorkshire LSIP leads on the key priorities and themes for the region and the work that has taken place to support industry and business within these priority sectors. The leads shared the work of the LSIF and how all types of providers can learn lessons from the curriculum activity and skills research that was undertaken by the projects.

#### National Panel

Following a brief break, we had an incredible line up for the panel discussion on the future of skills.

The audience shared questions prior to the session and we challenged each of our panel members to provide 5 words or less on their thoughts about the recent announcements and changes within FE & Skills and Ofsted - the responses below:

- Ben Rowland, AELP: "On a knife's edge unnecessarily.."
- Chris Nicholls, Association of Colleges: "Love our Sector Challenges Opportunities"
- Clarissa Wheeler, Ascentis AO: "More opportunities than limitations"
- Lou Doyle, Mesma: "Green shoots (but) don't faff around"
- Mandy Crawford-Lee, University Vocational Awards Council: "Major disruptors: Good & bad"

The panel then shared their thoughts on how vocational education will evolve over the next few years and the importance of employers and Government, at local, regional & central level, recognising the importance of vocational skills and all types of providers to deliver them. We discussed how the apprenticeship levy is set to change and what that might mean for more or less opportunities to work with businesses and what they would like to see included in the change.

The panel were open, honest, passionate, fun and inspiring to listen to, with audience interaction and discussion / debate on what we all think needs to happen to improve the Governments response to the skills sector. More funding from Treasury, more celebrating & showcasing with local MPs – they are your voice into parliament, and more collaboration to meet local and regional skills needs.
